Student has suspected disability

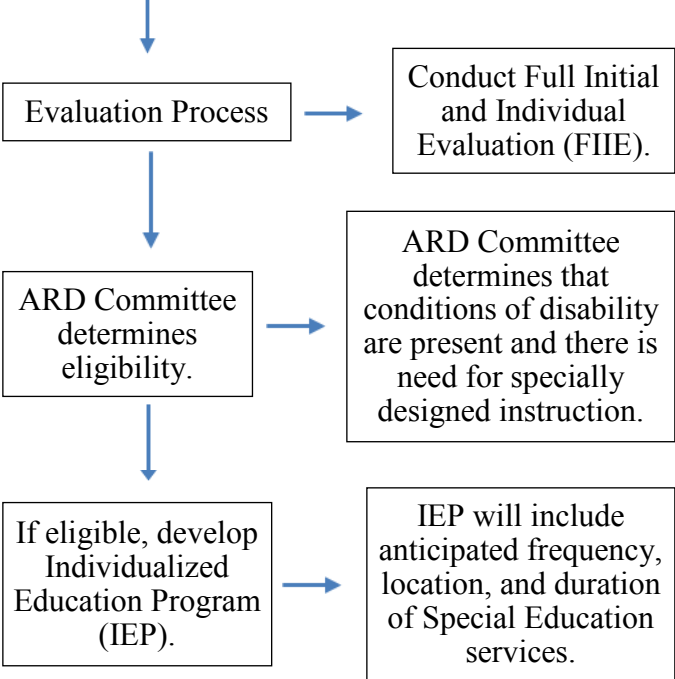
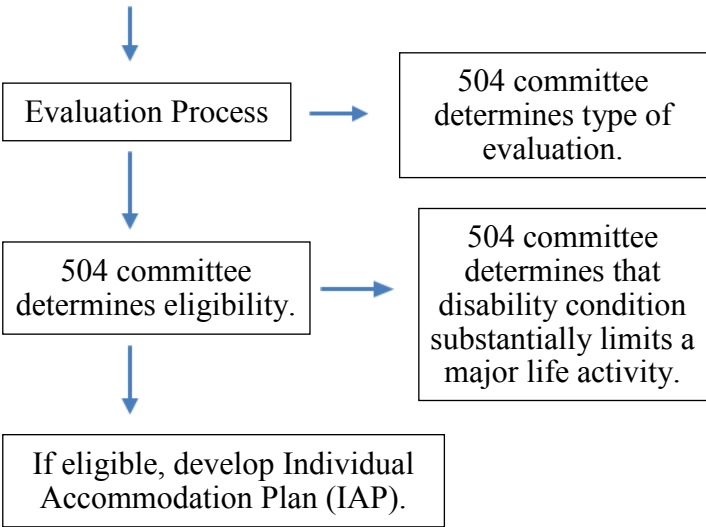
Review available data to determine if a referral to 504 or Special Education is appropriate. Data may include information from parent, physician, and school staff.

If implications of disability indicate substantial limitation to a major life activity and student may be able to function with intervention, accommodations, and/or assistive technology in general education classroom, consider referral to 504 COMMITTEE.

If implications of disability impact student's involvement and progress in general education curriculum, consider referral to SPECIAL EDUCATION.

If 504 committee determines that student needs are not appropriately met through 504, consider referral to SPECIAL EDUCATION.

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
