


Texas Medicaid Waiver Programs

Medicaid Waiver Programs fund services that help people (of all ages) who have a disability, blindness, or who are aging, live in the community instead of an institutional setting. Within each program you will find different eligibility requirements, rules, service options, and funding amounts. When you call to access services in Texas you will learn of an “interest list,” known by families and individuals who have a disability as actually being a “waiting list.” The list varies in length depending on the Waiver Program. Since regulations and procedures change periodically, it is important to check websites and with case managers periodically.
