ASD in 2018

The <u>CDC</u> determined that approximately 1 in 59 children is diagnosed with an autism spectrum disorder (ASD).

Most children were still being diagnosed after age 4, though autism can be reliably diagnosed as early as age 2.

Autism & Special Education in Texas

Texas Administrative Code § 89.1055

In 2000, 7,131 or 1.45% of children ages 3-21 who received special education services in Texas had autism.

In 2014-2015, 51,330 or 11.4% of children with disabilities ages 3-21 who received special education services had autism.

Texas Autism Supplement

The Autism Supplement is a document (form) and process that should be reviewed and discussed during your child's annual IEP team meeting.

There are 11 services that must be addressed at every annual ARD. It is stated in the federal guidelines that due to the intensity of this disorder, it is the obligation of the school district to address, consider, and justify why each of these services is or is not needed.





Texas Autism Supplement Background

1980's

- The first autism supplement was created with 7 areas.
- The Texas Legislature directed TEA to address parent concerns that schools were not providing adequate services for children with autism.

1990's

 Minor changes to the supplement were added.

2007

A new supplement
 was developed with
 four additional
 strategies (11 in
 total) and expansion
 of the existing areas.





Autism Top Needs Areas

- Verbal and Non-Verbal Communication
- Social Impairment
- Behavior
- Sensory
- Cognitive Function

11 Strategies to Consider

- ARD Committee must discuss all strategies, identify and determine each intervention needed based on data collected
- Requires documentation of student's progress from services and individual needs
- Requires qualified personnel and training for continued professional growth
- <u>Strategies</u> must be based on peer reviewed and research based educational programming
- Consideration of these strategies does not imply a requirement to implement
